I am very pleased to be able to contact you and explain the process as we approach the start of the new academic year on June 14th.

We were unable to run our normal "Timetable Promotion" last year, due to lockdown. It is one of the features that makes West Bridgford a little different – providing a boost to the final half term's learning in the summer term.

Years 11 and 13 will have finished their on-site lessons, and every other year group moves up a year to begin their new courses.

In the week after half term students will receive a paper copy of their new timetable, and also be able to access it on Brightspace. Parents will receive a letter explaining any ability sets that students have been placed in.

School will be closed for students on Friday 11th June, while the staff manage the hand-over of groups, books, rooms etc... then we start afresh on the Monday.

School Day

We have recently completed a student voice exercise with focus groups in each year. They had lots of interesting things to say – which we will share in WB Post – but specifically, the strong feedback was that we should keep the one-way system, staggered start and end of the school day, less students on each break/lunchtime and dividing the canteen up for year groups. Although these were all introduced for COVID control measures, they have also created a calmer and safer environment which students appreciate. It's easier to move around – and they get served quickly at lunchtime.

So that's what we will do - but with a few minor changes to reduce the impact on learning time.
