










German @ WBS Year 10 Roadmap

KA 3: Kapitel 5 Summer half term 1

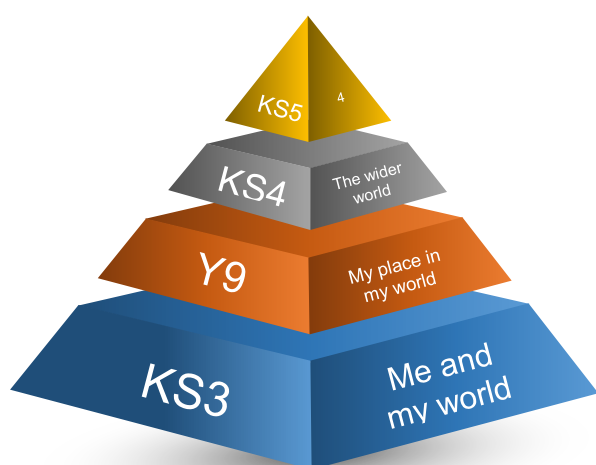
Homework and Revision
