


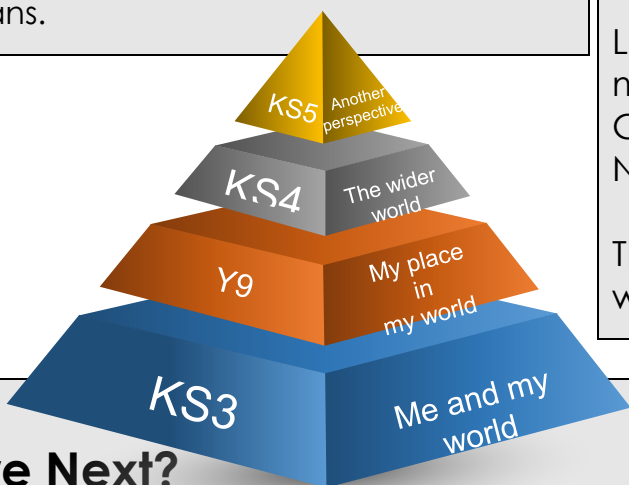


Subject Aim: In Y9 you will make the transition from KS3 to KS4 and you will begin the GCSE programme of study. You will revisit themes and **embed language** from Y7 and Y8 while beginning to learn about **My Place in My World**. You will begin to appreciate the importance of language the world of work and will have contact with Language Ambassadors. Your **understanding** of the language will increase. Key themes this year are family and relationships and free time activities. KS3 language will be revisited and consolidated with a wider view of the German-speaking world.

Autumn Term	Unit 1 – Identity and relationships with others 
	Revisiting the topic of family but with a deeper understanding and a broader perspective. Talking about yourself now and in the future, talking about relatives and describing them, relationships and understanding different types of families.
Spring Term	Unit 2 - Healthy living and lifestyle 
	Much of this topic is new – You will build from the grammar previously covered, near future and the perfect tense. You will talk about making healthy choices, health problems, healthy activities and lifestyle.
Summer Term	Unit 3 – Education and work 
	You will re-encounter the topic of school and will add knowledge of jobs and the world of work. You will focus on improving the imperfect and perfect tenses to talk about your school life and also the future tense to talk about your plans.

Assessment You will have 3 Key Assessments this year. Assessments will test a variety of skills and they will be different for each assessment. Revision will be on Classcharts and in lessons.
Homework and Revision Homework will be set on Classcharts and will consist of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vocab learning – on Carousel • Home and Workbook – will be sent home with you, this will be assigned at the start of the unit and due at the end before the assessment. Reminders of assessments are published on Classcharts and each assessment will revisit all the previous content of the course. This means you need to revise the recent topics but also revisit the old ones.
Enrichment themes Sport in German-speaking countries including regional Austrian sport and German's role on the European / international football stage. Linguistic identity and variation including multilingualism in Germany, Swiss dialect, and Germany as a mother tongue in the USA and Namibia. The German school system and job adverts as well as German-language careers.



Where Next?

In year 10 you will continue to apply the knowledge you have gained this year but you will also start to look at The Wider World. You will revisit the KS3 topics of holidays, town and festivals but study them from a broader perspective.
